

# The Protagonists of the *Satyricon*

- Encolpius
  - Speaking name: “On-The-Bossum”, “In-Crotch”
  - 1st-person (homodiegetic) narrator of the *Satyricon*
- Ascyltus
  - Speaking name: “Unwearied”, “Unshagged-Out”
- Giton
  - Speaking name: “Neighbour”, “Mate”

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

Fresco from Pompeii (1st century A.D.; now in Naples)







# Early Prints and Translations


- 1482: Franciscus Puteolanus, Erstdruck Mailand (Nachdrucke Venedig 1499 und Paris 1520) (nur „O-Texte“)
- 1565: Johannes Sambucus, Antwerpen
- 1575: Tournaesius (Jean de Tournes) und Dionysius Lebeus-Batillius (Denis Lebey de Batilly) (erster „L-Text“)
- 1577: Pithoeus (Pierre Pithou) (2. Ausg. 1587) („L-“ und „O-Text“)
- 1596: Variorum-Ausgabe, Raphelengius, Leiden 1596
- 1610: "Georg Erhard" (= Melchior Goldast), Frankfurt (2. Aufl. 1621)
- 1629: Theodore de Juges, Genf. Nachdruck der Goldast-Ausgabe, erste Ausgabe mit Kapitelzählung.
- 1664: Padua, Erstdruck der cena *Trimalchionis* („H“)
- 1669: Michael Hadrianides, Amsterdam (Erste Gesamtausgabe incl. cena *Trim.*)
- 1709: Petrus Burmannus Utrecht (Rhenum), (2. Ausg. Amsterdam 1743) mit umfangreicher Kommentarsammlung. (Nachdruck Hildesheim und New York 1974)
- 1773: Wilhelm Heinse „Begebenheiten des Enkolp“ (<http://gutenberg.spiegel.de/petroniu/enkolp/enkolp.xml>) „Rom“ (Schwobach b. Mitzlar) (erste deutsche Übersetzung)


