

POST-DOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP

Job description

A Post-Doctoral Research Fellowship (SKO 1352) is available at the Department of Archaeology, Conservation and History, University of Oslo.

The position is associated with the project *Symbolic Resources and Political Structures on the Periphery: Legitimization of the Elites in Poland and Norway, c. 1000-1300*, which is funded by the GRIEG-programme of the Research Council of Norway (link to project website).

The Post-Doctoral Fellow will be assigned to co-write two articles with Polish scholars on religious aspects of elite legitimation in Norway and Poland in the period c. 1000-1300, where the fellow will have a main responsibility for covering the Norwegian part of the issue. In addition, the fellow is expected to produce other results within the thematic frame of the project. The choice of themes is at their discretion. The Post-Doctoral Fellow will be expected to cooperate closely with the other participants in the project, which includes participation in meetings, workshops and conferences. The fellow will also be co-responsible for arranging conferences and workshops. In their project description, applicants should specify their research ideas regarding both the articles in cooperation with Polish scholars and their individual part of the fellowship. The candidate will be based in Oslo.

The position is available for a period of 40 months. There is a 25 % component of the position (10 months) which is devoted to teaching and administrative duties.

The successful candidate is expected to become part of the research environment/network of the department and contribute to its development. The main purpose of postdoctoral research fellowships is to qualify researchers for work in higher academic positions within their disciplines.

Requirements

- PhD or equivalent academic qualifications with a specialization in Nordic medieval history
- Demonstrated research competence in Norwegian medieval history
- The candidate's research project must be closely connected to the main project
- Fluent oral and written communication skills in English and a Scandinavian language
- Personal suitability and motivation for the position

The doctoral dissertation must be submitted for evaluation by the closing date. Appointment is dependent on the public defense of the doctoral thesis being approved.

In the evaluation of the applications, emphasis will be placed on:

- The project's scientific merit, research-related relevance and innovation
- The applicant's estimated academic and personal ability to carry out the project within the allotted time frame and contribute to the main project
- Good co-operative skills, and the ability to successfully join in academic collaboration within and across disciplines

- Curriculum Vitae with grades listed (with a list of education, positions, teaching experience, administrative experience and other qualifying activities)
- List of publications
- Project description (3 - 5 pages). The project description must present a feasible progress plan. It is expected that the applicant will be able to complete the project during the period of appointment

Diplomas, certificates, doctoral thesis and other academic works may be requested later.

The short-listed candidates will be invited for an interview.
