A Postdoctoral Research Fellowship (SKO 1352) is available at the Department of Archaeology, Conservation and History, University of Oslo.

The research position is connected to the research group "The Ancient Mediterranean: archaeology, history, and society" [link to web page]. The main research focus of the group is the relationship between archaeological and written sources in historical reconstruction, historiography and antiquarianism, and mythology, mythography, and cultural memory in ancient societies.

Applicants should propose an interdisciplinary research project that is relevant to the main research foci of the research group. The project description should clarify the theoretical and/or conceptual framework(s) and methodological approach(s) employed. Candidates are strongly encouraged to reflect on how the interpretive methodologies of both ancient history and classical archaeology are to be employed in the project.

The position is available for a period of 3,5 years. There is a 25 % component of the position which is devoted to teaching and administrative duties. These duties include obtaining basic teaching qualifications.

The successful candidate is expected to become part of the research environment/network of the department and contribute to its development. The main purpose of postdoctoral research fellowships is to qualify researchers for work in higher academic positions within their disciplines.

Requirements

- PhD or equivalent academic qualifications with a specialization in history or archaeology
- The candidate's research project must be closely connected to research group
- Fluent oral and written communication skills in English
- Personal suitability and motivation for the position

The doctoral dissertation must be submitted for evaluation by the closing date. Appointment is dependent on the public defence of the doctoral thesis being approved.

In the evaluation of the applications, emphasis will be placed on:

- The research project's scientific merit, research-related relevance and innovation
- The applicant's estimated academic and personal ability to carry out the project within the allotted time frame an contribute to the research group.
- Good co-operative skills, and the ability to successfully join in academic collaboration within and across disciplines

The application with attachments must be delivered in our electronic recruiting system, jobbnorge.no. Applicants with education from a foreign university must attach an explanation of their university's grading system.

The short-listed candidates will be invited for an interview.
