ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF SCANDINAVIAN LINGUISTICS WITH EMPHASIS ON NORWEGIAN AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

A position of Associate Professor of Scandinavian Linguistics with emphasis on Norwegian as a Second Language is available at the Department of Linguistics and Scandinavian Studies (ILN), University of Oslo. ILN is one of seven departments at the Faculty of Humanities (HF). The department faculty does research, teaching, and outreach within areas compromising general linguistics, multilingualism, medieval studies (Old Norse philology and Celtic studies), Scandinavian literature (including literature mediation and Ibsen studies), Scandinavian linguistics (including Norwegian as a second language), and rhetoric studies.

Scandinavian Linguistics at ILN includes the area Norwegian as a Second Language (NOAS). Candidates need to demonstrate experience in research and teaching within both areas, but experience in NOAS will be given more weight. Since many of our students are in the Teacher Education Program at the University of Oslo, this job announcement is directed in particular towards candidates with competence and experience relevant to the Teacher Education Program.

The successful candidate is expected to initiate and lead research, supervise PhD candidates, participate in teaching and in exam setting and assessment at all levels, and to carry out administrative duties in accordance with the needs of the Department. More specifically, the successful candidate is expected to teach and advise students in Norwegian as a Second Language and Scandinavian Linguistics, and to express themselves and give feedback in both Nynorsk and Bokmål. Candidates must therefore be highly competent in the Norwegian language, i.e. be able to use Norwegian both orally and in writing (Nynorsk and Bokmål) well enough to participate fully in all functions included in the position, and this includes the teacher education. The successful candidate should demonstrate that they have the necessary skills and competence to improve the quality of the teacher education at the Department by improving the collaboration among the school subjects at HF and the collaboration between these subjects and the Department of Teacher Education and School Research. The successful candidate should preferably contribute to the improvement of the quality of the education and by doing research relevant to the school, such that students at the Teacher Education Program in Scandinavian Studies are able to graduate with sufficient knowledge of the field and awareness of the relevance of the field for school.

Requirements

- PhD or equivalent academic qualifications with a specialization in Norwegian as a Second Language, Scandinavian Linguistics, or an equivalent subject.
- Research competence and teaching experience in Norwegian as a Second Language, Scandinavian Linguistics, or in a similar discipline.
- Documented pedagogical skills (either a teaching course certificate or based on teaching experience),

- Documented potential for project acquisition
- Personal suitability and motivation for the position

The following qualifications will count in the assessment of the applicants:

- Academic qualifications and academic production in Norwegian as a Second Language, but also Scandinavian Linguistics, or something equivalent, oriented towards Norwegian, with emphasis on works published within the last 5 years. Originality and innovative thinking will be weighted more heavily than quantity
- Ability to demonstrate how one's own research and competence are relevant to teacher education the school system
- International peer-reviewed publications
- Experience with research projects
- Potential to contribute to the long-term development of the academic and research environment at the Department
- Pedagogical qualifications and disposition to inspire students

- Interest and ability in leadership and administration
- Ability to create and contribute to a positive environment for collaboration
- Experience with and ability to build international networks
- Skills within popular dissemination, public outreach and innovation

In the evaluation of the qualified candidates the full range of these criteria will be explicitly addressed and assessed.

Academic quality, development potential and breadth will be prioritized in this order. The selected candidates are expected to contribute to the objective in the University of Oslo's strategic plan to 'strengthen its international position as a leading research-intensive university through a close interaction across research, education, communication and innovation'.

The successful candidate who at the time of appointment cannot document basic teaching qualifications will be required to obtain such qualifications within a two-year period.

The successful candidate must demonstrate mastery of both English and one of the Scandinavian languages as working languages. If an appointee is not fluent in a Scandinavian language, the appointee will be expected within a two-year period to learn sufficient Norwegian to be able to participate actively in all functions the position may involve.

Applicants are required to describe and document the entire range of qualifications and criteria described in the announcement of the post with concrete examples.

Please note that all documents must be submitted in English or one of the Scandinavian languages, either in the original or in translation.

Selection procedure

As the first step in the evaluation process, a Selection Committee will assess all applications and invite the most qualified applicants to submit a portfolio of educational certificates and academic works (up to 10 publications, which should not exceed 500 pages in total) for expert assessment. Applicants who are invited to submit academic works are asked to select three works, published within the last five years, to be considered as most relevant for the position. In longer publications (monographs), applicants should specify the relevant pages. Applicants are further asked to submit a description of one or more research projects considered relevant for the Department. Applicants are also asked to submit a portfolio that documents other qualifications (public outreach, teaching and supervision, and any experience with leadership and administration).

Finally, the most highly ranked candidates will be invited to an interview and a trial lecture.

Within his/her normal duties and in accordance with his/her academic competence, the person appointed may also be asked to work outside his/her Department. The appointment is made under the condition that the employer may change the subject area and assigned tasks according to the needs of the Department.
