DOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP IN SCANDINAVIAN LITERATURE

Job description

A Doctoral Research Fellowship (SKO 1017) in Scandinavian literature is available at the <u>Department of Linguistics and Scandinavian Studies</u> (ILN), University of Oslo. ILN hosts two research sections in this field, the Scandinavian literature section and the Centre for Ibsen Studies.

The Scandinavian literature section has distinguished itself internationally for its research on central Scandinavian authors, literary periods, narratology, book history, reception, and socially relevant themes.

The <u>Centre for Ibsen Studies</u> is an interdisciplinary and internationally oriented centre that produces Ibsen-related research within reception and adaptation studies, the digital humanities, performance studies, book history, and textual analysis. The Centre has developed several digital resources that facilitate new methods and approaches.

The Scandinavian literature section and the Centre for Ibsen Studies invite qualified applicants to submit an application with project description.

ILN has several <u>research groups</u> and <u>research networks</u> that can function as a useful network during the PhD period.

The successful applicant will be affiliated with one of or both research sections and enrolled in the Faculty's organized researcher training program. The fellowship is intended to result in a doctoral dissertation that will be submitted to the Faculty of Humanities and defended for the degree of PhD. The successful candidate is expected to participate in a research section or network and contribute to its development. Read more about the <u>doctoral degree</u>.

The appointment is for a duration of 3 years. All PhD candidates who submit their doctoral dissertation for evaluation with a written recommendation from their supervisor within either 3 or 3 ½ years of the start of their PhD fellowship will be offered either a 12- or 6-month Completion Grant respectively.

Qualification requirements

- A Master's degree in Scandinavian literature or equivalent. The Master's degree must have been awarded by the application deadline.
- Fluent oral and written communication skills in Norwegian or another Scandinavian language, as well as English.
- Personal suitability and motivation for the position.

To be eligible for admission to the doctoral programs at the University of Oslo, applicants must as a minimum have completed five-years of higher education (Master's degree or equivalent), including a

Master's thesis of at least 30 ECTS. In special cases, the Faculty may grant admission on the basis of a one-year Master course following an assessment of the study program's scope and quality.

In assessing the applications, special emphasis will be placed on:

- The project's scientific merit, research-related relevance and innovation
- The project's connection to one or more of the above-mentioned research areas
- The applicant's academic potential and personal ability to complete the project within the time frame
- The applicant's potential to successfully complete the researcher training program
- Good collaboration skills and ability to participate in interdisciplinary academic communities

Applicants who have recently graduated with excellent results may be given preference.

Educational certificates, master theses and the like are not to be submitted with the application, but applicants may be asked to submit such information or works later.

The application with attachments must be delivered in our electronic recruiting system, please follow the link "apply for this job".

Short-listed candidates will be invited for an interview.
