# A Doctoral Research Fellowship (SKO 1017) in Media and Communication is available at the Department of Media and Communication, University of Oslo.

The research fellowship will be connected to the project Living the Nordic Model (see <a href="http://www.uio.no/english/research/strategic-research-areas/nordic/research-groups/living-the-nordic-model/">http://www.uio.no/english/research/strategic-research-areas/nordic/research/research-groups/living-the-nordic-model/</a>).

"Living the Nordic Model" is a multidisciplinary research network at the University of Oslo. Current global challenges like migration, economic inequalities, growing infertility and digital technology influence the ideals, practices and institutions of the Nordic Model. Beyond its abstract theorizations, the "Nordic model" is the sum of all the micro interactions, decisions, and the lived everyday practice of the citizens of the Nordic countries. The project therefore aims to contribute to the understanding of how the "Nordic model" relates to the lived experience of its current citizens and citizens of the future, i.e. the Nordic children. "Living the Nordic Model" problematize the foundations of the "Nordic model" by examining historical and current ideals, practice and institutions related to the formative stages of its citizens' lives—childhoods, parenting values, the institution of the family, kindergarten, school and media. Against this background we invite candidates with projects that thematically fit within the project description. While the call is open for all aspects related to the project, the PhD project proposal must have a clear connection to the media and communications field.

The candidate will be part of an international network, and will be given the opportunity to work with researchers across the world.

The person appointed will be affiliated with the Faculty's organized research training. The academic work is to result in a doctoral thesis that will be defended at the Faculty with a view to obtaining the degree of PhD. The successful candidate is expected to join the existing research milieu or network and contribute to its development. Read more about the doctoral degree.

The appointment is for duration of three years. All PhD Candidates who submit their doctoral dissertation for assessment with a written recommendation from their supervisor within 3 years or 3 ½ years after the start of their PhD position, will be offered, respectively, a 12 or 6 month Completion Grant.

## Qualifications

- A Master's Degree or equivalent in media and communication studies, sociology, psychology, education, statistics or political science. Candidates with master degrees from other academic disciplines might be considered pending on the project description
- The Master's Degree must have been obtained by the time of application
- Personal suitability and motivation for the position
- Fluent oral and written communication skills in English

To be eligible for admission to the doctoral programmes at the University of Oslo, applicants must, as a minimum, have completed a five-year graduation course (Master's degree or equivalent), including a Master's thesis of at least 30 ECTS. In special cases, the Faculty may grant admission on the basis of a one-year Master course following an assessment of the study programme's scope and quality.

In assessing the applications, special emphasis will be placed on:

- The project's scientific merit, research-related relevance and innovation;
- The applicant's estimated academic and personal ability to complete the project within the time frame;
- The applicant's ability to complete research training;
- Good collaboration skills and an ability to join interdisciplinary academic communities.

Applicants who have recently graduated with excellent results may be given preference.
