

## **MEVIT3427/JOUR4427 Media, War and Journalism - Exam 2019**

### **Grader Guidelines**

A: Confident use of sources to illustrate an original and independent argument. In-depth understanding of the literature and evidence of a great deal of reflection on it. Well written and flowing.

B: Solid critical and nuanced argument that shows in-depth understanding of the literature and is well supported by it.

C: Reasonably good knowledge of the literature. There is evidence that the syllabus has been read. Basic concepts have been understood. Different arguments are considered critically. Overall, though, the essay tends to repeat the literature, with little evidence of originality or an independent stance.

D: Does not give a clear answer, not well structured, not well focused, presents relevant material but it is not clear where the discussion is going. If there is an argument this is not critical and/or is one-sided.

E: Attempts to address the question. Some relevant points. Shaky knowledge of the syllabus. Even basic concepts have not really been understood. Little evidence of reading.

F: Very few or no sources from the syllabus. Does not address the question. Possible relevant points but not connected into an argument. Contains irrelevant material. The text might contain sections but they are disconnected.

These guidelines broadly apply also to the MA level, although there students are required to answer a more complex question. The analysis and argumentation is also expected to go more in depth and to show a higher level of maturity than at BA level.
