# **Obligatory Activity**

You need to submit a draft (at least 3 pages, more or less a third) of your term paper. It is fine to submit more than 3 pages, if you have the material. The point is to get feedback about your work in view of the final submission. Although it is a draft and it will be unfinished, make sure that the <u>text is coherent</u>. This means that a series of bullet points or a very fragmented piece of work will not pass. It should be a genuine start on your work for the final assignment. You need to pass this assignment in order to proceed to the exam (i.e. submission of the whole, finished term paper).

## **QUESTION FOR THE TERM PAPER**

Select the right question for your level of study, either BA or MA.

#### BA level - MEVIT3427

It is often claimed that political conflict today is all about spectacle, image, and propaganda, not substance. To what extent is this true and what does this mean for the role of the media and journalism in conflict? Answer this question by using theoretical frameworks, concepts and arguments from the course readings, and, if relevant, class discussions. Make sure you evaluate a variety of arguments and include one or more examples of conflict to illustrate your points. You are required to refer to relevant reading sources in the syllabus. You can use other sources, if you wish, in addition to them, not as a replacement.

## MA level - JOUR4427

Answer these questions by using theoretical frameworks, concepts and arguments from the course readings, and, if relevant, class discussions. You can use other sources, if you wish, in addition to them, not as a replacement.

If you are unsure of how to use sources and citations properly, <u>please consult the University library's</u> resource page, or the <u>Search and Write webpage</u>.
- Before you submit your term paper, you must also ensure that it conforms to the University's rules regarding cheating.
- The file you submit must be a PDF file (.pdf). Other formats (e.g. .pages., or .odt) will not be accepted by Inspera.
- Do not include your name anywhere on the submission.
- Your file should be named after your candidate number, for instance 1234.pdf.

## The front page of your term paper must include the following:

- Your candidate number (available in Studentweb)
- The course code and course name
- The correct semester (spring 2023)
- The title of your term paper
